My dear Mr. Hastings:

We have your letter of June 16, regarding the desire of Louina Walker, now King, for a conference here concerning an additional allowance.

1000 to Louina 500 to Jacob

Our records show that Mr. and Mrs. King are being paid a monthly allowance of \$1,500, and in addition we have authorized the purchase of automobiles and supplied other requests of this family. In view of the liberal allowance now being made we do not feel that Mrs. King would be justified in incurring the expense of a trip to Washington for a hearing with the view to obtaining an increase in her monthly allowance. However, in the light of your interest in the case, Superintendent Landman has been asked to give Mrs. King a hearing regarding any matters on which she may desire to be heard, and to present the same here for our consideration.

Where Indians have large accounts we are as a rule liberal in our allowances for personal and family needs, but do not sanction employment of attorneys by restricted Indians in connection with their allowance.
