I hand herewith a letter of introduction from my friend Pat Hurley and a copy of letter addressed to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs concerning a request of cash payment for Louina King, which is self explanatory.

I had letters from Senators Thomas and Gore and Congressmen Hastings, Disney, McKown and Cartwright requesting a respectful hearing on our application but the Commissioner immediately rendered his decision denying our application and admonished her not to come to the Office any more but take this matter up with Superintendent for the Five Civilized Tribes.

Mrs. King is about 60 years old and may not live long in this world and she certainly would like to liquidate her obligation before she passes away, which amount to \$7500.00 and balance of the \$20,000.00 will be spend judiciously and wisely.

I would like to have met you and explain in detail about this matter but very sorrow to learned that you are ill in bed but if you think that I stay over, I shall be glad to stay over, awaiting your reply and trust that your recovery will be speedily,
