APPLICATION FOR CASH PAYMENT.

I, Louina Walker, now King, Seminole Roll No. 1577, of Holdenville, Hughes County, Oklahoma, do hereby ask, and apply for a cash payment out of my funds now on hand with the Department, in the sum of \$10,000.00.

I have now on hand in the Department \$403,000.00 in bonds, and considerable money. The income from my property is at least \$1200.00 or \$1500.00 per month besides the interest on my bonds. I am now past sixty years of age and in failing health. I know that I do not have long to live and most of my children are fairly well fixed financially, and there are several things I wish to use this money for. I desire to help my church, improve some of my places, and there are numerous other things which I desire to do of my own accord and without supervision or intervention of anyone. I feel that I am entitled to have at least this amount of money to do with as I see fit and without supervision. And especially is this true at my age and in my physical condition.

If you will grant me this request I will put the money in the First National Bank at Holdenville, Oklahoma, and use it for my benefit and pleasure my remaining days. I have never asked for a large cash payment and have always conducted myself as a good citizen. The Department here and at Muskogee knows that my reputation is good for paying my debts and being a law abiding citizen.
